Frequently Asked Questions

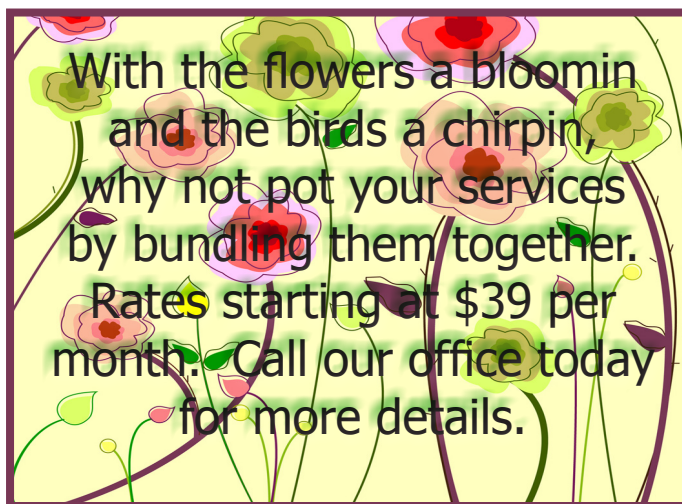
This month's question is...What does ICE stand for?
